- 7. HAB Presentation Visibility in the lake has gone down. John Holz reported that jar testing has been done. Results showed that there are growths affecting the alum treatment and the dose will need to be increased next time. There is also a large amount of phosphorus at the bottom of the lake. The recommendation is to apply the necessary dose in equal amounts over two years. The cost for this would be around \$950,000 per year. This would be for about 190,000 gallons of treatment materials. These treatments would last 25-30 years. John Holz recommended applying for grants to help cover the costs.

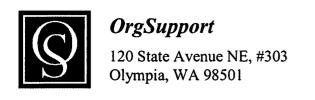
